All students were mesmerised for almost an hour listening to a range of traditional Chinese musical instruments. It was the first time that most of the students had ever seen or heard traditional Chinese instruments played. A special thank you to our LOTE teacher Mrs Williams and the Confucius Institute at UWA for facilitating their WSPS visit.

Hi Everyone

I recently attended the WACSSO forum for the State Election. There was a panel consisting of Peter Collier Minister for Education, Sue Ellery Shadow Minister for Education, Greens

Representative Alison Xamon and Nationals representative Mia Davies.

All panel members spoke briefly about their positions on Education. They answered submitted questions on Education. It was mentioned that the Education Policy is the most important component of this election. The Western Suburbs are very powerful with major issues concerning new/reinvented schools causing concern for those communities.

For us in the East the issues were; infrastructure (old buildings), public transport, Education Assistants and mental health. The partial sale of Western Power is intended to tackle some of these issues. Is this the best way to fund these improvements? Being informed is the only way to make a decision on election day. I recommend you investigate the WACSSO position paper response summary State Election 2017. This paper outlines how these and other issues are being addressed. http://www.wacsso.wa.edu.au

It was also mentioned that parent engagement in the school communities is essential. Schools like WSPS, where the engagement of parents is strong, are most successful in retaining staff and looking after our kids. Cyber safety and cost of BYOD policies were also discussed, with all the panellists agreeing that technology is an increasingly challenging fact of life in schools and homes. The impact of health and how classrooms can be infected by disability or anxieties was also addressed.

I don't want to say who you should vote for that's personal. I always look at who in my small pocket of Australians is working the hardest to improve my families position in the community.

We had our first meeting for 2017 last week. You have received a survey for our lunch order days. The P&C

Committee provide a day, generally each month where lunch can be ordered. This can only happen with your help. Volunteer to help on the day with cooking, packing, planning. The first one will be held on March 29. Use our post box (outside the uniform shop) to return the survey forms.

Place your lunch orders in an envelope with the correct money, child's name and learning area. (There are some envelopes attached to the post box.)

We will be having an Easter Raffle, tickets will be available form the March 17, which is our ride to school day.

Uniform supplies are being topped up so remember to put your orders in to ensure you can get what you need.

The funds we raise with these endeavours benefit our children. We have new playground equipment being constructed, shade sails for the juniors is on our wish list and we are even planning chickens for the River Ranger Cadets to raise and nurture.
